'To be a centre of God's love and h

From the Vicar's study:

ontinuing on from the topic of "who to love" on 7th September, the topic considered during the mid-week service on 14th Sept 2022 was "what is love!" The apostle Paul wrote, "And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love" (1 Corinthians 13.13). Although three qualities are mentioned, the emphasis is on love!

Paul's emphasis on love as the greatest was because love was absent or at best at very low levels in the Corinthian Church. Although this church had an abundance of spiritual gifts (i.e., the ability to prophesy, gifts of knowledge and faith, the ability to speak in languages unknown to humankind), love was absent/low. The absence of love resulted in pride, disunity, disharmony and distrust!

So, what is that kind of love that is essential for a church, in our family, in our relationships with others or even in society in general? Paul explains ... "Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth. It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. Love never ends." (1 Corinthians 13.4-8)

That's quite a list for a church to practise as we relate or interact with one another here, with other Christian communities and even with people who do not follow Christ. It is as relevant and crucial ... especially as while we are building our relationship with others, we discover something about the other that we do not like—even disturbing/shocking. It is during those difficult discoveries when we should immediately realise that love is more than just words.

That kind of love (i.e., love that is patient, which is not envious/rude, that does not insist on its own way, that isn't irritable, etc.) isn't easy in one's own strength. That kind of love can only be sustained by the unlimited and gracious love of God through Christ. In fact, Christ modelled that love for the church & for humanity as an example for us all!

S Sanil, a pastor in the UK, wrote this about love ... "Bell is no bell, unless you ring it ... Song is no song, unless you sing it ... Love is no love, unless you give it." The love visualised in 1 Corinthians 13 is a love that cannot be kept within an individual or even within a group.

That kind of love is always given away ... like Jesus did. May we all do likewise!
