

April 2024 Parish Council (PC) update



The meeting began with exploration of John 6.30-35—

"Manna in the wilderness or the Bread of life!" One apology was received. The following are some of the items discussed:

- Parish Fund Raising monthly Cards Night on the second Saturday playing Crazy Whist, from 7PM to 10PM at a cost of \$10/person. The first monthly Cards night is on 11 May - enquiries to Shirley and/or Gwen.
- Asylum Seeker fundraiser lunch in the Narthex on 18 May cost \$20/person enquiries to Don.
- Archbishop's visit 16 June Combined service @ 10AM followed by lunch.
- Musical concerts with Anthony Hahn (date/s and other details TBA)
- Finalised the final portion of parish giving to help ease the cost of living pressures of many in society (50% each to Brotherhood of St Lawrence and Anglicare).
- Finalised and sent the Diocesan Assessment documentation to the diocese
- To fill important vacancies, PC agreed to convene a statutory parish meeting (12 May) after a combined service at 10AM. The agenda will be:
 - Election of one parish nominator (female);
 - Election of two reserve parish nominators (one male & one female).
- Discussed protocols (particularly privacy) for the prayer chain, diocesan support for parishes experiencing conflict and the management of parish keys.
- Noted with concern the reduction of volunteers in many areas resulting in more work for this smaller group of volunteers. There is now an urgent need for more volunteers for Sunday hospitality, especially in the kitchen, flower arrangers, Bible readers, intercessors, etc.

Parish Council were very encouraged to receive/read the monthly LyCiG Movement circular. An example of a parish who worked through the LyCiG process for <u>seven</u> <u>years</u> was cited. This particular parish had 230 people at their Mothering Sunday service, 65 were children. This was unimaginable! Sunday attendance was around 80 and there were around 15 children on the roll. While this was considered not bad in comparison with the national average, the potential for growth was still there but not being fully realised. What caused this significant change?

Their desires changed. While they were delighted if a young family came to church, there was very little discernible desire to be the sort of church they would want to come to. They then realised that they need to make changes to the physical environment and committed to an annual budget to children and young people work. They talked, planned, prayed and took action.

At the last count, they now have over 100 children or teenagers every week. Interestingly, this parish did not have paid staff doing the work and they did not have a limitless budget. Much of what happened in this particular parish was a

step of faith. It did not happen overnight (seven years as mentioned earlier)!
