'Set apart & Sent' - Learning from the early Church

A disciple of Christ is one who has decided to be set apart from the world. They are to be distinct/different from other people wherever we are. If a disciple of Christ is no different from others around us, what is the point, I would ask?

On Wednesday the mid-week congregation continued our exploration of learning from the early church! This week, we considered the church in Antioch (Acts 13.1-5). As they were worshipping the Lord and fasting, the Holy Spirit said, 'Set apart for me Barnabas and Saul for the work to which I have called them.' (Acts 13.2).

Saul as you should know, is later renamed Paul. Together with Barnabas, God had set them apart for something special. To be 'set apart' is to be called. Notice also that this church prays & fasts to discern the will of the Spirit. Then they willingly send Barnabas & Saul! (Acts 13.3)

'Sent' is the other word that captured my attention, and it is repeated in Acts 13.4. They were sent by the church in Antioch. To be sent means, to let go; to be released, discharged. To be sent, implies the release (annulment) of an existing bond. Barnabas and Saul had to let go their previous involvement/participation/responsibilities in the Antiochian Church and move on. But ultimately, the one who 'sends' is the Holy Spirit.

Returning to Acts 13.1-5 and in any other similar situation, for those who are 'sent' and for those 'sending', there will always be sadness on both sides. It is in one way a parting but, in another way, it isn't, because we still remain in the body of Christ.

Even Jesus speaks about being sent! 'Whoever believes in me believes not in me but in him who <u>sent</u> me. And whoever sees me sees him who <u>sent</u> me.' (John 12.44-45)

Friends, being a community of disciples of Christ in Bentleigh, we must always remember, that we have all been set apart from the world and we have all been sent into the world.

This fledgling church in Antioch was amazing! There are lots which we as a church should learn and emulate. They had remarkable leaders. Some well-known (even to this day), some mentioned only once & long forgotten until we read Acts 13.

The leadership was multicultural. Long before multiculturalism became the pattern nowadays, the early church was multicultural. They were even active, supportive in church planting! They were generous, willing to obey the Spirit in sending out their best people to the mission field for the gospel! They were united in prayer and fasting. They did not hinder the Spirit's profound move. They actively utilised the gifts of the Spirit (e.g., prophesy and teaching). But I am sure they were more.

An anonymous person wrote/said, "I've always thought the actions of a person were the best interpreters of their thoughts."

Friends, it is useful to regularly and carefully reflect, what do the things we do in St John's reveal about us (the individual, the community)?
