A message from The Revd. Philip Higgins.

Dear Friends,

Have you seen the film *The Great Escaper?* Its about an elderly bloke (like me!), but one who is quite a bit older. Michael Caine plays the role of a 90 year old, who along with his wife (played by Glenda Jackson) live in a coastal aged care facility on the south coast of England. He decides to take the initiative and travel to France to attend the 70th celebrations of the D Day landing, with lots of flash backs. The Caine character makes a mate for the duration of the short trip. At the end this character says something like they will meet up next in heaven. This new mate explodes and challenges such Christian belief.

Do you tell people that you go to church, or do you keep such activity to yourself? At this Easter time it is good to reflect on how much we share our faith. We have to be confident to do so. The Michael Caine character didn't question his new mate. What is the point of arguing with somebody who has lost his temper and who loves a Bible basher? The thing to do is to say quietly to a friend, "Can I tell you why I go to church?" or "How about I tell you about Jesus?"

In today's gospel reading Jesus says to his disciples, *Peace be with you*. We need to call on such a prayer – Jesus grant me your peace. If discussing our faith with others we might well pray that Jesus will surround us and our conversation with his peace. Try it.

As we enter into Holy Week, we lament the suffering due to the ongoing war in the Holy Land.
