From The Vicar

Dear people of St John's,

We have entered the last month of 2020, a memorable year for all the wrong reasons, especially here in Melbourne. We should be very thankful that COVID19 has for the time being been eliminated in Victoria, and vigilant lest it regain any significant hold through an infected visitor or returnee to this State. Finding the new 'COVID normal' is proving difficult. We need to be careful, but we also need our leaders to make



decisions that arise from sound judgements about the now greatly reduced risks, rather than out of their own trauma as they led us through this crisis. Life and productivity needs to be allowed to return, fully.

As I write it is still not clear what restrictions will apply to our public observance of Christmas. These may become clearer this Sunday. As you probably know, we resumed public services on 15 November, with a congregational limit of 20. This has now risen in our case to 57, which for us means that everyone can return! Restrictions may still apply regarding distancing, fellowship, singing and refreshments. I hope that our experience of restrictions will make us mindful of Christians who are not allowed to come together at all, ever, to celebrate God's love in Jesus.

The time of lockdown has not been unfruitful at St John's. Please read below about progress with our building plans and our building appeal. Please note that we are committing to making our services available ongoingly on line, recognizing that not everyone can join us every Sunday, and that making our services available in this way creates a window for people possibly interested in joining St John's in the future

We have a newly elected Parish Council, following last Sunday's AGM. The Council will have a big task discerning what our *Mission Action Plan* should be as we emerge from restrictions. *MAP2021* was suspended early in the year due to the impossibility of pursuing most of its goals in lockdown. One of the last decisions of the old Parish Council was to suspend our Playgroup ministry for 2021. The demand for playgroup places has changed, and the Corona Virus has meant that the one remaining St John's playgroup met very few times in 2020. We do thank Lisa Eames and those who have assisted her, for her ministry with playgroups at St John's over the last three years. Parish Council also determined to apply for diocesan assistance to expand our paid children's ministry and to change its focus. Please see below an ad for a part-time Children and Family Minister at St John's, a position which we hope to fill in time for the start of the new school year.

I very much look forward to seeing you at our Christmas services, and hopefully before.

Christmas Day Services

These services will follow last year's pattern, albeit with some restrictions. As many of you as possible are encouraged to attend the Christmas Day services if their intention is to attend only one of the Christmas services. This is because the Christmas Day Services have tended to be smaller in past years. This should avoid the danger of running out of space to accommodate the swollen numbers at the larger services. Using the Narthex area we should manage to fit everyone

in it, though the seating will be different from previous years.

We are delighted to report that we shall have a traditional *Nine Lesson and Carol Service* this year, albeit with a reduced choir, but still singing in full harmony. We really hope that congregational singing will be allowed by that time, for at least some carols, ideally without masks, but some level of mask wearing may still be required. But the main point is, there will be a carol service for 2020, at 8pm on Sunday 20 November. All will be welcome.

The Children's Christmas Service will be, as in past years, at 5pm on Christmas Eve, and will include decorating the Christmas Tree, and using our near life-size Palestinian figures to recreate the story of God's coming amongst us born in a shed in Bethlehem.



Lockdown News

St John's is open again for public worship, after seven and a half months of being closed or severely restricted. It is no longer necessary to book to attend services, and we look forward to welcoming everyone back very soon. There are some restrictions still, but some of these may ease soon (hopefully congregational singing), though others will probably remain until vaccines have been widely administered. Service times will continue, for the time being, on Sundays at 8.30am (Holy Communion most weeks) and 10.30am, and at 10.30am on Wednesdays (Holy Communion each week).

A weekly online service from St John's (it will be the 10.30am service recorded and possibly transmitted live) will continue to be available, and the best way to access this will be by subscribing to the St John's YouTube channel

New Parish Council

At the Annual General Meeting last Sunday 29th November, we had 'elections' for our wardens, other parish council members, and parish representatives on the incumbency committee for the coming year. Not all positions are finalized, because the Vicar has appointments still to make, and there are in any case some vacancies on Parish Council. This is partly due partly to the decision at the Statutory Meeting on 10 Nov by Zoom (the vicar was outside his caravan in Healesville) to increase the number of ordinary parish council members from 6 to the default number of 9, and partly to the synod legislation requirement that people not serve for more than six years in a row. Long-serving and valued members Stephanie Hogg and Rosemary Hogg became ineligible for appointment as a result.

The new wardens made their appointment of one of their number to the incumbency committee.



My heart is full. I know that we all want St John's to be filled with love and hope and joy. Thank you to all who have contributed. Please continue to pray for this appeal and how you can help build for future faith at St John's.

After much too-ing and fro-ing between Architects – heritage consultant – council planners and our own Building Committee we finally have some building plans that satisfy all parties. It has been many months of waiting, negotiating, changing, tweaking and has involved many Zoom meetings, moments of frustration and also some compromises. I would like to personally thank all members of the Building Committee, ably led by Terry Nisbet, for their determination to ensure the best outcome for our buildings going forward. The plans seen in this edition of the parish news are a good indication of what the end product will look like. For those who, like me, find it challenging to 'see' the outcome of the plans... here are some words to help!!! And the plans are printed on the next page.

The main entry foyer from Tucker Road will be extended, have a stunning glass façade and a metal awning with prominent 3D signage stating "ST JOHN'S ANGLICAN CHURCH". The restrooms will be relocated to the near end of the hall. An additional unisex toilet will be added to service the Cooper Centre and also the retained but refurbished meeting space adjacent to the current kitchen. The old kitchen space will be turned into

hall storage space. A new centrally located kitchen will be built with modern appliances, cabinetry and finishes, and serving windows into both the hall and narthex. It will be perfect for our fabulous hospitality.

Building works progress

The November *Parish News* carried extensive coverage of works completed under stages 1 and 2 of our building program. There has been some further progress, with more expected in the next week. Isuru Perera has complete what Telstra started a few months ago - he has completed the repair of weatherboards and the external painting of The Cooper Centre (see photo). In the coming week the windows in the

hall still required post stage 3 will be replaced – in modern double-glazed aluminum, speakers, an amplifier and a donated projector will be installed in the hall, and the equipment to allow the inconspicuous video recording and livestreaming of our services will be installed in the worship area.

The planning for stage 3 has continued too. We have had to adjust our plans to meet the requirements of the Glen Cooper Centre exterior has been repainted.




Eira heritage advisor, we understand successfully, and the plans have been submitted for approval this week by diocesan authorities. An application will be made soon for approval of an Anglican Development Fund loan, and the plans will be taken for planning approval as soon as they receive heritage and diocesan approval. The hope is to go to tender early in the new year! The excellent support for the Building Appeal has given great encouragement in proceeding as we are.


Here are some views and plans of the main area to be impacted by the proposed stage 3 works.
